

SCHOOL REPORT CARDS - HEADING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION



Since 2016, legislative action has changed the computation methodology of overall report card scores for schools and districts across the state of Wisconsin. The legislative changes changed the way different aspects of the school report cards were weighted and required an entirely new process for measuring growth. In 2017, it was noted that small districts like Cambria-Friesland were experiencing large fluctuations in scores. Because it was unclear if these changes reflected changes in performance or demographics, districts with more than a 10 point change were marked as outliers. Cambria-Friesland improved by almost 20 points that year and was labeled an outlier.

In 2019, for the first time, 9th and 10th grade ACT Aspire tests were added into the calculations for achievement, growth, and closing the gaps. Again, small districts were seeing some large fluctuations. This time in the Closing Gaps portion of the report card. However, this time, the state determined that they would simply not include this portion of the calculation for any schools that showed more than a 20 point change in this portion of the report card. Cambria-Friesland Elementary improved by 14.7 points in this area and received an Exceeds Expectations overall rating on their school report card. Meanwhile, the Cambria-Friesland Middle School/High School improved by 22 points; so, this area was not included in their overall score. Without it, they remain in the Meets Few Expectations category. However, with that score included, they would have been in the Meets Expectations category.

Aggressive evaluation of curriculum and implementation of different instructional strategies is having an impact. We are seeing improvement in all areas and at all levels; however, there is still more progress to be made. After training and implementation of district-wide changes in English Language Arts curriculum, we see an increase in the percentage of students scoring Proficient or Advanced in this area. The percentage of students scoring Proficient or Advanced in Math held steady. The MS/HS implementation of CPM (College Preparatory Math) continues as this year Algebra courses adopted this curriculum. At the elementary level, Math Expressions was adopted PK-5 including a wide range of supports for students and teachers. As we move forward implementing these changes with fidelity, we hope to see a similar impact in math scores in the coming years.

They are an excellent source of vitamin C.


