Did You Know?

- Research tells us a student with a 90% school attendance rate, and is involved in two or more co-curricular activities (athletics, FBLA, FFA, etc.) are prepared for postsecondary careers.
- School ATTENDANCE is 8 times more predictive of success in freshman year than eigth grade test scores.

These are good reminders that school attendance and being involved in at school makes a positive difference in the success of your child's education.

Winter Wheat

Just after Thanksgiving 2019, a friend shared with me a brief story about "Winter Wheat". After some thought, the comparisons of winter wheat to education couldn't be ignored. But how could a simple agricultural product like winter wheat have anything to do with education? Let's think about that for a moment. Shared by my friend, "Winter wheat (usually Triticum aestivum) are strains of wheat that are planted in the autumn to germinate and develop into young plants that remain in the vegetative phase during the winter and resume growth in early spring." In many ways winter wheat reminds me of the journey our students and staff embark on every fall. The seed is planted and nestled just an inch or so below the surface where it begins its life process with the hopes of a harvest in eight to nine months. Ready to be used in a thousand different ways, the wheat has a multitude of uses... but my favorite would be freshly baked bread. Like the seed, our students come to school for nine months and every day they take steps in their transformation. Time is relative. Eight months for a Kindergarten child is a lifetime, whereas for a middle aged woman or man it's the equivalent of about ten minutes of a good movie. For the K-12 student those months are part of a growth cycle where lifetime foundations are being cultivated. But like the ground where the winter wheat is planted we can't see the germination process taking place, but it does. Nature has a way of pointing out to us how important it is for us to appreciate time and its relevance to our lives and the lives of our children. Cambria-Friesland Schools is home to approximately 385 students. Like the winter wheat, our students for the nine months of the school year are given the opportunity to be nurtured, supported, and eventually transform, change, and grow. Over a period of years this leads to high school graduation and the first steps into adulthood. Like the seasoned farmer, this transformation happens only through the attention and diligence of an incredibly dedicated parents, family, staff and the caring communities that comprise Cambria-Friesland Schools. Public schools are built through a shared vision and on the shoulders of it's communities.

FOSTERING GRATITUDE

How often do we as adults feel concerned that young people today, both our own children and their peers take too much for granted? When we think about everything that is available at our children's fingertips, things we may have had no access to ourselves at their age, we marvel that they don't appreciate these things.

Tim Elmore is an author, international speaker and world-renowned expert on the most recent and upcoming generations. One of his many articles touches on ways that we often unintentionally reduce our children's gratitude and foster a sense of entitlement or lack of appreciation for the positive things in their lives.

When possessions and perks like the latest technology or current trend in clothing or shoes are treated as needs and access to them is assumed, it reduces gratitude. When children are given things instead of earning them, it increases the feeling that even the most frivolous items are actually needs.

You may have heard the following said in the past: "Too many people buy things they don't need with money they don't have to impress people they don't even like." "Acknowledging the good that you already have in your life is the foundation for all abundance."



Psychologist Jean Twenge's research identified a correlation between materialistic culture and sadness in young people. When our focus becomes connected to the things we have, not only are we less likely to feel grateful but we actually can experience sadness and even depression. Moving our focus to time and experiences, particularly those that we have together with our families and our peers can help.

Lastly, American novelist James Baldwin noted that, "Children have never been good at listening to their elders, but they have never failed to imitate them." It's often easy for us as adults to forget to show gratitude ourselves. These are missed opportunities that we can use every day that will not only a provide positive influence on our children, but also enhance our own mental health. (growingleaders.com/blog)

Handbook Highlights

The ending of a semester does not always bring the success and progress we would desire. When we reach high school, the focus turns to earning the credits necessary to graduate and meet our long term goals. Some classes may have gotten off to a rocky start, or we may have had trouble consistently keeping our grades up. Either way, we may fall short of what is needed to pass a class. If a student needs to recover lost credits, please be aware there are different options for different circumstances and meeting with the school counselor and the teacher of the course is recommended.

Credit Recovery

Students who fail a course will either repeat the course in the classroom or may have the option of earning the required credit in an online environment. When repeating a course, both the original course failure and the repeated course will be included in student transcripts and GPA calculations. With instructor and administration approval, students may be offered a credit recovery option that does not require repeating the full course. In such cases, the original course failure will appear on transcripts and be part of GPA calculations. However, completed credit recovery agreements will appear on transcripts as pass/fail courses and will receive credit but not be included in GPA calculations.

Where do Social Skills Come From?

Are social skills learned? Are we born with social skills? Should we be pushing our kids into more social interactions with their peers from a young age to develop those skills? Unfortunately, I don't have an answer for you. What I have come across, however, is that social skills come from home and at a young age. If we can take a sports analogy, home is where children can practice and hone their abilities in communication. School and public is where they can perform what they've practiced. Home is where they can try out new things and it should be a safe environment to do so. This is also where children can learn from modeling their parents and caregivers. Every interaction we have is an opportunity for our children to observe appropriate communication. Every time a child witnesses their caregiver on the phone they are learning how that process is completed. When a child observes their caregiver holding the door for someone, exchanging pleasantries, and remaining calm but assertive with a store manager or customer service rep, they are learning. A child's social skills are first learned from their "first teacher" and the lessons never stop. If you are concerned about your young child's social skill development, take advantage of their natural desire to play and use make belief to simulate conversations and social interactions. Playing is a toddler/preschooler's "work" as it hones skills and starts neural pathways that will lay the foundation for their social interactions.
