

Administrator's Letter

School Reopening in the Age of Covid-19

Life has been very different for all of us lately. Since early March, we've entered a time that is without comparison and absent of perspective. All of us minus young children have experienced loud and even violent summer thunderstorms. Because of previous year's storms we're allowed comparisons from storm to storm and summer to summer. But what comparison do we have for a global pandemic? Few of us were around in 1918 when the last health crisis of this magnitude rocked our world. Our ability to cope with a significant event is typically ushered in with previous life's experiences, or comfort in learning how others close to us were able to deal with a similar situation. For those of you who've lost a family member, you understand exactly what's shared here. So, where are we at in reopening school in the fall?

We know all factors today indicate students and staff will be attending school in the fall. What that looks like will look different from previous years. Our success in remaining open will fall somewhat on our own shoulders as well as the course of the pandemic. Education and acting with foresight will work in our favor in staying open. Precautionary measures by everyone will make a difference. Any expectation of returning without adaptations to the disease should be dismissed. How we do this will be guided by our school and county health officials. Communications moving forward with our parents and students will be key to a successful first day of school on Tuesday September 1st and every day after that.

In preparation for both a stronger face to face educational experience as well as unexpected student/staff absences and even school closures, the district has moved forward with several initiatives to promote student learning, connectivity, and accountability. Schoology, is a K-12 web based learning platform that allows teachers to build their lessons for their classes and provides individualized attention for students beginning this year. To enhance our Elementary Reading and Mathematics, the district has moved forward with Freckles Reading, Freckles Math, and MyOn Reader. To assist parents in understanding these learning platforms the district is planning a series of parent/student online meetings throughout the remainder of the summer. These presentations will allow parents to understand how these programs will be utilized at school and home to support student learning and achievement. In this edition of the district newsletter you'll find postings for the upcoming educational webinars.

Finally, as we move to that first day of school there will be many questions and uncertainties. That's the way it's been from the beginning, but through our communications we'll be able to continue to navigate these waters together.

Social Justice & Race

What is social justice? It's a term we've heard a lot for the past several months. What is Black Lives Matter? Does BLM negate or support the sanctity of all human life? I cannot remember a time in history, where so much upheaval and unrest is also surrounded by so much angst, uncertainty, or clarity. Born in 1965 I'm unable to contrast this moment in history with the Civil Rights Movement, Lyndon Baines Johnson signing of the Civil Rights Act, and his War of Poverty. Almost like the third rail of a subway, subjects such as race, gender, gender orientation and so on are things that we sometimes deem uncomfortable to confront. But that's the insidious nature of these matters, our level of comfort denies the opportunity to appropriately address these issues as needed. Education has been and remains the one medium to best address these societies problems. Without anger, without hate, but with an expectation of empathy and understanding can we ensure a safer school, community, and world for everyone. Cambria-Friesland Schools has a robust history of inclusivity and awareness to these issues, and we'll continue to do so.

DOING THINGS DIFFERENTLY - NOW AND IN THE FUTURE

We have learned a lot over the past three months. We've learned that communicating with students and families when students are not physically attending the school building is both more complicated and more critical than when they are able to attend school. We've learned that many skills we believe all young people have regarding using software and devices for school are actually missing for some youth.

We've learned that many students, families, and teachers are resilient and more than capable of rising to the challenge of a complete shift in the routines of education. However, there are still many individuals, both within the school and among the families we serve, that struggle with these changes; and it isn't always who we thought it would be. The savvy, productive, and responsible student when we are in school does not always retain those skills working more independently and sometimes the student that struggles to engage or maintain focus on learning while in school does surprisingly well working from home.

There remains a lot of uncertainty about what school will look like over the next few months and how things will function when school resumes. But, we are learning from our experience this Spring and building for success regardless of the format.





One thing has become very clear. We need to have consistent, streamlined, and reliable communication and information about learning activities and requirements. These need to be accessible by both parents and students and it is best if it is all in one place as much as possible. While Google Classroom provided some of this for some students and families and some classes, it remained disjointed. So, this summer, staff will be learning and adopting a new Learning Management System called Schoology to be implemented in the Fall across the district.

Schoology will integrate directly with PowerSchool for student information and grades unlike Google Classroom. This allows parents to see, in a single place both what their child has going on in their classes and how they are doing with grades and assignments. They can choose to view this information from their own parent view for all their children in every grade of school, or they can switch to the student view and see what their child sees. Parents will have options for notifications they prefer in either email or text message format.

Students will also be able to see all their classes, messages and reminders from teachers, calendar events and upcoming assignments that are due in one place as well. We're looking forward to this change and the positive impact we anticipate for all involved whether students are in classrooms or at home in the future. We will be sharing access information and guides as part of the adoption process to help everyone understand this new tool.

BEING TIK TOK SAFE

If you've wondered what Tik Tok is, it's a social media app with many similarities to common social media apps like Snapchat, Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter. It allows users to connect and share information, with a focus on watching, creating, and sharing videos where individuals or groups often dance and/or sing along with popular music tacks. Tik Tok challenges have increased the use and popularity of the app, particularly with teens.

Tik Tok has been criticized regarding issues of censorship, privacy and child safety by many advocacy groups and even by US senators. Some of the concerns are the same as any other social media app and others are a little more specific. For example, Tik Tok is a Chinese owned company which sometimes hampers prosecution of cases involving harassment or solicitation that may originate in the app.

However, some of the biggest concerns are related to the app permissions and privacy. While it makes sense that the app requires access to the camera and microphone, the access to GPS location information as well as information on any simultaneously running apps can expose children and adults to both solicitation and to hackers.

It is possible to enjoy the app and avoid some of these larger concerns. First, make sure that any GPS or location features of your phone are turned off when using the app. User location information is routinely gathered and stored on the applications servers which are not all housed in the US. Second, fully close (not just minimize or allow to run in the background) other apps while using Tik Tok. In particular, be certain that any apps with sensitive information like banking, password, or identifying information.

Age makes a difference on Tik Tok, so make sure that if your child is using the app, that they've entered their correct age and that the account is private. You can control who comments or sends direct messages as well as who a person can duet with. Tik Tok restrictions for users under 13 only allow watching videos and creating clips for private viewing free from the data tracking the company collects on other users. New and updated safety restrictions have also disabled direct messaging for users under the age of 16 to reduce solicitation. This is based on the birthdate the user enters when they install the app. So, be sure your child's is correct, but also be aware that it is easy for adults to put in false information and pose as younger children on the app. So, teens still need to be wary of communication with any unknown individuals.

Tik Tok also has Digital Wellbeing settings for Screen Time Management, Restricted Mode, and Family Pairing so parents can manage a child's account from their own phone and passcode protect privacy settings so teens can't change them.

As we all grow and learn, one of the most important lessons is how we manage our personal privacy and security while still enjoying fun and new ways to interact with our friends and family. It an age of physical and social distancing, awareness and knowledge about how to safely interact online is a critical life skill and certainly one worth talking about and building with our children and teens.

Our children are often not far from being an extension of ourselves. especially when it comes to anxiety and stress. That's why modeling is the first line of defense in helping your child learn how to handle stressful situations or anxiety inducing situations. The same can be said for the upcoming fall. If you could ease your child's stress and anxiety for the upcoming school year and it's uncertainty, your answer would probably be "yes!". That starts with managing our own stress and anxiety and the language we use to address uncertainty. THE CLASS OF 2020 - UPDATES AND CHANGES

Cambria-Friesland School District has postponed their Class of 2020 Graduation ceremony to <u>August 15, 2020 at 2:00 p.m.</u> The format of the ceremony will depend on the status of public health guidelines from the State and County at that time.

- Plan A will be a traditional graduation ceremony. This plan will be implemented if guidelines at the time allow for public gatherings without size restrictions.
- Plan B will be a graduation ceremony with only the graduating class and necessary staff. The ceremony will be livestreamed and recorded for viewing during and afterwards by family and friends. This option will be used if guidelines at the time allow for public gatherings of at least 50 people.
- ➤ Plan C will be a virtual graduation ceremony to be publicly released at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 15th. This plan will be used if guidelines at the time restrict public gatherings to less than 50 individuals.

To allow for planning and preparation for the ceremony, a decision about the final format will be made by August 1, 2020.

A Virtual Awards Ceremony for Seniors will be published as a video. Awards for underclassmen will be announced online with certificates delivered to homes in the mail in June.





























2019-2020 Honor Roll Incentive Program




