Administrator's Letter

Cambria-Friesland Annual Meeting and Budget Hearing

On Monday, October 26, 2020, the Cambria-Friesland School District held its annual school district meeting as regulated by Wisconsin state statutory requirements. Although much of the meeting reviews and approves duties and responsibilities of the School Board and District, the meeting is often dominated by the presentation and approval of the school district's annual budget.

From the 2019-2020 school term to 2020-2021, the equalized value of the district grew from \$210,444,824.00 to \$222,603,128.00, a growth of \$12,158,304.00 or 5.78%. This equalization value growth resulted in an overall lower mill levy of \$11.47 per \$1,000. This has resulted in a decrease of .69 cents from the 2019-2020 school year. Please note the equalized value is not the same as it's assessed value. Equalized valuation is also referred to as the fair market value. The fair market value is an adjusted value of property made by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue. A total levy of \$2,519,206.00 was approved at the Annual Meeting.

For the week of November 2 - 6 the district closed due to COVID-19 related reasons. The pandemic continues to have high infection rates and our district, like the rest of the state remains part of those increases. As a district we have made a commitment to providing a 5 day/week face-to-face learning experience for our children. To assist us in mitigating the threat of the virus within our walls we remind our parents and families to be conscious of illness and sickness at home. This includes contacting primary physicians and doctors when there are suspected cases of COVID-19 within the family. Children of families with suspected or confirmed cases need to remain at home until it is determined whether or not they're not contagious. Communication with school officials by our families is essential to ensuring we're doing all that we can to keep the disease outside of our building and from our classrooms.

Moving into the second semester of the year, the district is examining a continuation of the online learning programs. We realize for some families and students the virtual learning option has not been a positive experience. Not knowing the direction of our state and areas positivity rate, the district is anticipating a renewal of these virtual learning options. As we move into January, we will be providing listening and learning sessions for families who may want to move to the virtual learning option.

With Thanksgiving around the corner, I hope that throughout all the challenges our students, families, and community members have experienced all of us we take a moment to recognize the many good things that are part of our lives. It's when we're challenged most that all of us have the opportunity to be thankful for the people and things we do have everyday in our lives.

Elementary Counselor Corner

"30 Million Word Gap"

Several generations ago a study was published that suggested that by age 3. the wealthiest children will have heard 30 million more words than their poorer counterparts. While this study has been under fire over the past decade, the ramifications of language acquisition have not been debunked. While "30 million" may be hyperbole, experts still suggest that quality, face to face conversation with our toddlers is a crucial aspect of learning to communicate and ultimately, learning to read. This suggests the reading achievement gap is environmental and one of the best things we can do to prepare our children for this world is to give them the power to communicate and set them up for success in literacy.

Some ways to support your toddlers journey to talking are:

- Copy your toddler
- Show them items and name them
- Keep communication face to face and uninterrupted
- Sing to your toddler
- Keep the environment quiet (no tv in the background)



Learning on Hold

In an effort to return to some level of normalcy, I would like to share the findings of a research article from three years ago, the results of which are as true today as they were when published. Smartphone use, over the last decade, has been a topic for discussion. Typically we find ourselves complaining about children's screen consumption and teens obsession with their smartphones. At first glance we conclude that these devices must be harming our children's ability to concentrate and complete tasks, eroding their patience, and helping to create a society craving instant gratification.

The research I am focusing on, however, suggests something overt occuring with the constant connection to our devices:

Research has proven that responsive interactions are imperative for language development for children. Through communicating and observing communication in a predictable manner, children can obtain language. The earlier a child can utilize their verbal language, the earlier they can begin to use that language to help them complete tasks, fulfill needs, and learn.

This research suggests that parent-child interaction in the 21st century is fraught with interruptions, disrupting normal language learning patterns. This means that our children are acquiring language later which leads to learning important language concepts later. While the consequences may not seem dire, that our children must learn patience when adults are "busy", the reality is we are the teachers of language to our children. We teach them societal norms and back and forth communication, uninterrupted, should be one of them. The study found that children as young as three could recognize the violation of conversational maxims when a parent disengaged with a child mid conversation to look at or answer their smartphone. Toddlers whose conversations were interrupted performed worse on different cognitive tasks than those whose conversations were not interrupted. 

Additional testing dates include November 6, 2020, November 20, 2020 and December 4, 2020. *

This event will be held at the Cambria Fire Department located at 702 Elizabeth Street, Cambria. The free testing is open to the community and appointments are NOT necessary. In an effort to save time, we encourage online registration. If you do not register online, you will still be tested. Staff on site will assist in the registration process. Registration should be done no sooner than 24 hours prior to the event at https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/ Due to the unknown amount of interest, prepare for potential wait times. It is requested that vehicles form a line and stay in the mode of transportation at all times. No restroom facilities will be available on site, please plan accordingly.

The National Guard will be doing the testing, they will be in uniform and full personal protective equipment. Individuals will be contacted with their results within 3-7 business days. A reminder to continue using safe practices like washing your hands, staying home and social distancing. 
