

Administrator's Letter

Cambria-Friesland School District October, 2019 Monthly Newsletter

This year, the district moved forward with a new plan to address student needs in technology. In previous years we've allowed students grades 6-12 take their Chromebooks home. This was good for our students and remains so, but too often it was at a cost to both the student and the district. Lost or broken and/or uncharged chromebooks, resulted in numerous issues for the student and their ability to appropriately use the chromebook. This was problematic for the student as well as her/his teachers and classes. To address the technology needs of the students the district worked to create that opportunity, but not at the detriment to either the student or the school.

Students/Families who purchase a cord and pay the chromebook insurance:

- May take chromebooks home every night/weekend
- Have purchased a chromebook charger to ensure the chromebook is charged for next day use.
- Have purchased insurance: This is a first dollar coverage. If the student damages their chromebook, this insurance is applied in addressing the damage.
- The insurance is a one-time fee. If used the student/family doesn't have to buy more insurance.

Students/Families who choose not to use take the chromebook insurance:

- Students who choose not to take the insurance have full access to their chromebook throughout the instructional day, but cannot take the devices home.
- Students who damage their chromebook through negligence or abuse will be held accountable for cost of repairs.

I realize this was a change in previous years practice. The issues of the previous system resulted in a number of problems that at times compromised our students, their learning experience and the school. In short, the insurance provides a level of ownership for the student in the use and care of their chromebook devices.

Attendance Counts

This year, students and families will be hearing more from the school should their child have struggles with daily attendance. To the detriment of the child, too often we have students miss an inordinate amount of school throughout the year. For some it's being late 3-4 times a week for 10-15 minutes. For others it's a request every week to be out of district for part or all of the day. If you have questions about attendance here are some easy things to remember:

By state statute:

- A student may miss 5 days each semester through parent/guardian excuse. This includes sickness, vacations, family events (weddings, funerals, etc.). As you can see those five days can add up quickly.
- Students who have a medical appointment should provide a note from the doctor that documents their time out of school.
 Medical excuses do not count against a students 5 day count. Medical excuses are valid for medical appointments, dental, vision, mental health counseling, etc.
- The same holds true for legal proceedings. The courts will provide documentation for the time missed from school. If you have any questions regarding attendance please feel free to contact the school at your convenience.

TIPS TO PREVENT STUMBLING THIS FALL

<u> Handbook Highlights</u>

Who really reads handbooks? Often, it's not until after a problem occurs that we really read them carefully. This month, to hopefully help address an issue <u>before</u> it happens. I would like to highlight part of the handbook related to tardiness.

Tardiness

When a student is late in reporting to their 1st period class, he/she is to report to the office before going to class. If the tardy is not excused, he/she will receive a detention. No student may be tardy (excused) more than two times per school year. The determination as to whether additional tardies (after two) are excused or not rests with the principal or his/her designee.

Now, this isn't a new thing or a change from what was written in the handbook in past years. However, it is something that we are seeing an increasing need to enforce in a consistent way. Being at school on time is not only important for learning but one of the key skills and indicators that employers are looking for in their future employees. Please emphasize with your students the importance of being to school on time. Thank you.

What is a better time to celebrate and practice being enthusiastic than October? With homecoming and Halloween, students will have many opportunities to show enthusiasm for their school and community during the month of October.

Thoughtfulness is like a superpower. It gives you the ability to see why you do the things you do and why you feel the way you feel. If you don't know why you are doing something, why do it? If you don't know why you feel the way you feel. then that feeling is meaningless. Cambria Park Improvement Project Update

After several years of park planning which included a district wide survey, grant writing, fundraising, project planning and bidding The Cambria Park Improvement Project is proceeding. The contract for the trail and excavation work was approved by the village board in June. Per the contract final completion of the trail is to be done by November 15th. Plantings, benches, concrete work, shelter, picnic tables, and fish sticks (fish protection) will be done in 2020 with a completion date of June 30th.

Contractors are so busy that it was difficult getting bids for the project. This resulted in the village having to bid in both the fall of 2018 and spring of 2019 before getting a bid for the trail and excavation work but still never got one for the shelter. This put things on hold for a bit and we had to ask for a one-year extension to complete the work. Now that a contract has been awarded things are moving forward. Regarding the shelter, we will be purchasing a shelter from a company and will use volunteers to assemble it onsite. If you have the skills and knowledge and are willing to help with the assembly of the shelter please contact the Village Office at 920-348-5443 or cambrid@centurytel.net and provide your name and contact information so we can contact you when that project is scheduled.

Other volunteer opportunities for this project include helping place the fish sticks (trees) on the lake in January or February and helping with plantings that will be done in the spring or early summer after the excavation and trail are completed this fall . If you are willing to help with either of these projects contact the Village Office to leave your contact information and we'll let you know when each project is scheduled.

Also, we will be in need of trees for the fish sticks, if you have any Locust, Spruce or Juniper trees that are 20' - 30' or larger and willing to donate them for this project please let us know. Or if you have any equipment that would be able to haul this size tree and are willing to help, even if for a fee, please let us know.






