Administrator's Letter

Cambria-Friesland School District October, 2020 Monthly Newsletter

Continuity of Learning and Cambria-Friesland Schools

This fall the School District of Cambria-Friesland determined to reopen school in the traditional, face-to-face format. A number of families chose to remain home and enroll in virtual programming while several others opted to home school or attend elsewhere. What we've learned since our first day of school is that we have new challenges everyday in providing a quality education for all of our communities students. Mostly, we've been reminded that we are not in control of this virus. We never have been and any notion that we're able to manipulate or navigate school without consideration of the disease has quickly disappeared.

But, we have learned through adaptation and some compromise, like many other school district's around the nation we are able to provide our students with a safe learning environment. We've also learned that much of what comes into our building is determined by the decisions our students and families make outside of the forty-hour school week. Good decisions on where we go, who we meet with, and what precautions we take have consequences that are relevant to our daily operations here at school. Please remember that a school is only a reflection of what a community values. These values are more than the core characteristics of what comprise our communities, but also the actions we take which can have either positive or negative consequences for our neighbors and friends.

At the printing of this newsletter the district has had a total of four positive COVID-19 cases, both students and staff. Considering the state and national numbers, this isn't too surprising. Decisions of whether or not to remain open, contact tracing of the disease, and how best to communicate are not done within a bubble. All cases of COVID-19, both suspected and known are reviewed with Columbia County Health and Human Services officials as well as our school physician and nurse. The school assists the County in the contact tracing process as their workload has grown exponentially over the past several weeks.

Final note: This disease is real and is best fought by the practice of good habits by everyone. Wash hands, social distancing and wear masks. It works not just for you, but most importantly for every person you come into contact with. If that isn't the definition of an active and engaged community, then I don't know what is.

School is in session, athletic events are happening, and we are all happy to have gotten a start to the new school year. I'm very proud of how well almost all of our students have adjusted to the changes. There have been challenges - but students are doing their best to keep themselves and those around them healthy.

Sixty-five parents have activated their accounts and are able to monitor and help their children. There have been some challenges when some parts or pieces don't want to play nicely together (I'm talking to you Google!), but the tech gurus of the nation are working to help schools around the country function smoothly. So, we are working through the challenges as we go and in the first 10 days of school over 3000 assignments were submitted via Schoology.

We're looking forward to continued good healthy habits and learning as we navigate these uncharted waters.

Temporary Handbook Adjustments

We have temporarily adjusted some of our student handbook elements to account for public health concerns regarding COVID19 at this time. These will be reviewed regularly and students will be informed if there are further updates.

- 1. MS/HS Students enter the building through doors 9 and 10 in the morning unless they arrive late.
- 2. Face coverings are required in the building.
- 3. All students receive free breakfast and lunch and have been provided barcodes for scanning rather than entering numbers with a keypad.
- 4. Students carry their bookbags to classes to reduce time spent clustered at lockers in the hallway during passing periods.
- 5. The MS/HS office has restricted access to two individuals at a time.
- 6. Campus is closed. Students may not leave school for study halls or lunch periods during the day.
- 7. Locker rooms are not being used for PE classes at this time.
- 8. Students are encouraged to use passes during class periods for the restroom instead of clustering in the restrooms during passing time.
- 9. Study hall students remain in their classrooms.
- 10. Students should regularly take chromebooks home and ensure they are charged at home so they are ready for the following day.

We're Here! ... Now What?

It's hard to believe but here we are. As I type this we have been with students in the classroom, face to face, for the past three weeks. It's different, yet the same. Once the excitement of being back in school has worn off, students get in their groove and start making those academic and social emotional gains that we at school strive for ... and yes ... as the novelty of being in person wears off and children become more comfortable with the prospect of wearing their masks throughout the day, they still encounter the growing pains of youth. Drama, relational aggression, jealousy, home sickness, and everything else still exist in our Covid 19 school bubble.

It's not easy being a kid, and that's doubly true in 2020. When we pile the stressors of school, the expectations, the peers, the pandemic, it's truly amazing to see their resilience. That being said, it is the children that need to be watched out for the most during times of change and heightened stress nationwide. How do we really know how our little ones are doing? Well, one of the most common signs that the stress and anxiety of change or of a situation for children is a "tummy ache". As many adults know, chronic stress or anxiety can manifest itself physically. For children, this is often a stomach ache or nauseous feeling without any other symptoms. What is difficult about this type of anxiety, is that the child believes that they are sick and often cannot connect their bad feelings and anxieties to the stomach pain.

So, what are we adults to do? We have a child that believes they are sick and developmentally it is very difficult for them to make the connection between stress and anxiety and physical discomfort. A good first step is to investigate for any changes to the child's routine. This could be a new sibling, a move, or even returning to school. Once you have an idea of the source of your child's anxiety it may help to ease their concerns surrounding it. Reassuring them that everything will be alright and letting them know that you're there. While letting your child avoid things that cause them their anxiety may be a quick fix to get rid of those tummy pains, it only reinforces avoidant behavior and fails to address the underlying issue. Children can overcome those anxieties, but, as the saying goes, "experience is the best teacher", getting through the occasional upset tummy may be necessary.




