**Referendums and Beginning of the End for 2020-2021 School Year**

Thank you's are deservedly in order to the entire school district of Cambria-Friesland for the successful school referendum vote on April 6th. Much can be drawn from the April 6th vote. The number of yes vs. no votes, the number of referendums that passed and failed at the state level that evening. The district has much to consider as we enter the next three years. Budget adjustments and cuts necessary as we adapt to our decreased enrollment and decreased funding sources. These discussions will also include consideration of initiatives that will sustain the necessary programming and promote initiatives and coursework that will continue to make Cambria-Friesland Schools and communities a competitive place to call home for current and potential families.

Every day we're in school from now through the end of the year is different for all of us and even new for some when compared to 2019-2020 school year. Except for several days of closure in the first semester Cambria-Friesland Schools have remained open and have been able to provide face-to-face learning for all students 4K - 12. A full-time virtual option has also been made available to students and families who determined that was best for them. Heading into the final months, the district has expanded its activities, and has allowed for class/activity field trips, spring sports, and so on. In a year where many school districts in our area and state felt the need to compromise the instructional school day to accommodate for the pandemic, Cambria-Friesland Schools has remained open. This is something that I hope all of us should hold with some level of pride and accomplishment.

On Thursday, May 6, 2021 the district will be hosting a community brat and hotdog fry during our home baseball and softball games against Markesan. Open House and a school tour has been scheduled that evening as well. As we emerge from the pandemic, the district thought it would be good for us to find ways to get together, support CF athletics as well as each other. All food, refreshments, and workers that evening has been provided by the CF Booster Club, and private donations. I hope you can join us on the 6th for a night of ball games, brats, and community spirit!

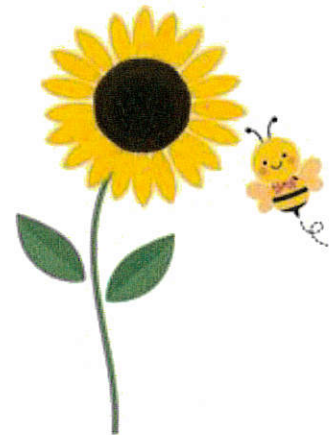

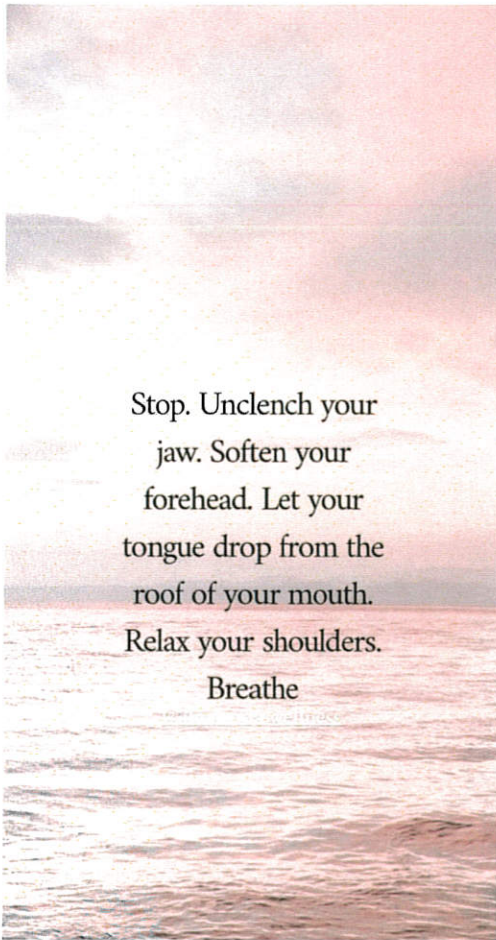

- Peer group leadership skills.

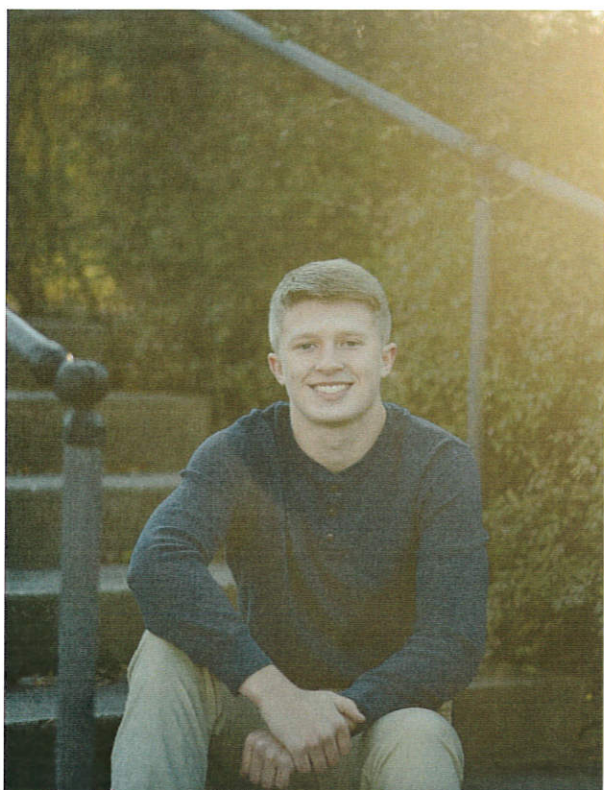
### Play helps build strong relationships.

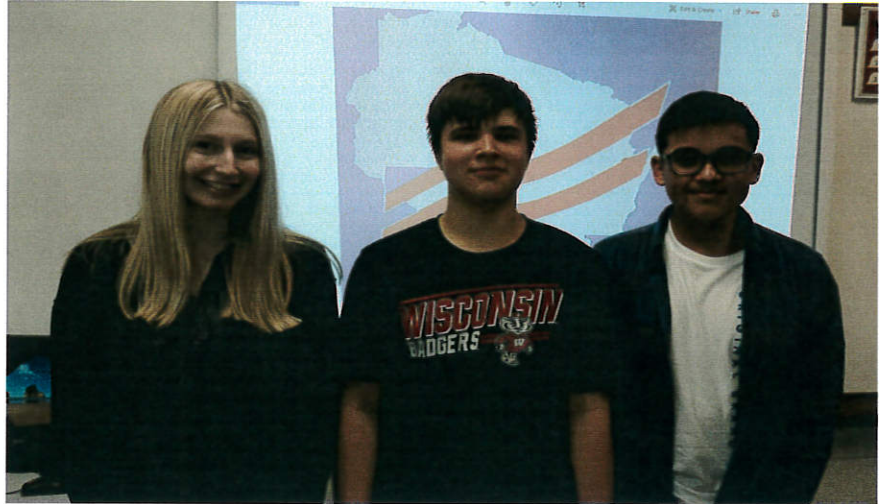

### What is being done in the elementary to prepare my child for a career?

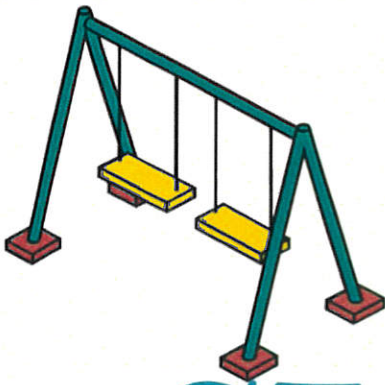

**Get Your Read On!** (Carla Woebbeking): This class has been specially designed to meet the needs of students who need additional support in grade level reading. (Teacher recommendation required)  
Grades 1-6



**Virtual Vacations** (Shelley Adel): Pack your bags, we have places to go- virtually. Students will fill their digital passports with a variety of adventures from all over the world. Destinations may include Disney World, Washington DC, National Parks and Monuments, Zoos and Museums and more. Activities surround each place we visit. Don't miss the opportunities that await!  
Grades 1-3; Grades 4-8

**American Girl Adventures** (Shelley Adel): Explore history by learning about the historical time periods of American Girl dolls. Discovery through crafts, games and activities using American Girl dolls as a springboard to their adventures. Students do not need to own a doll to enjoy this experience.  
Grades 3-5

**Horses, Horses, Horses** (Ellen Richter): Students will study one of Earth's most amazing creatures, the horse through history, literature, applied mathematics, cooking/baking, games, guest speakers, and more. No prior experience with horses necessary, nor do you have to have a horse to participate in the class. *Maximum of 12 students*  
Grades 2-8

**Game Station** (Matt Raymond) Students will have an opportunity to learn and play various games. Games will include board games, card games, various puzzles and domino games. **MS Basketball Skills**(Stu Quade): This class will focus on developing the fundamentals necessary to become a better basketball player, including all facets of offensive and defensive basketball techniques. The basics of common offenses and defenses will be examined. Participants will be physically active during this class so you are required to wear workout clothing and gym shoes.

**Introduction to ESports** (Emily Ramirez) This course offers an exciting introduction into ESports, the form of sport competition which uses video games. In Introduction to ESports students will gain a basic understanding of how Esports games are organized and played through peer partnerships and instruction. In addition, Esports promotes teamwork and strong communication amongst players. Maximum of 14 students - Filled on First come First Serve.

**Credit Recovery** (Jackie Drews): Students who did not pass classes have the opportunity to receive credit by completing PLATO classes via the internet. Students in need of credit recovery will receive an invitation. Students are expected to attend during the scheduled time or until the classes(es) are done with a satisfactory grade.



**MS Fitness & Conditioning** (Emily Ramirez) For all MS athletes and non-athletes, come get into shape for the upcoming school year.
